

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



GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Entries are welcome from the City of Franklin, Southampton County, and adjacent Virginia Cities and Counties.
- 2. PRE-REGISTRATION of entries is strongly suggested. The official registration blank or a reasonable facsimile will be accepted through August 1, 2023.
- 3. Exhibitors may enter only one article per class, but may enter as many classes as desired.
- 4. No article will be accepted unless it has a class listed for it in the premium book. Articles entered in the miscellaneous, other, or exhibitors choice must not fit in any class listed elsewhere in the premium book. (Give a description of these classes on the entry form)
- 5. The exhibitors are solely responsible for deciding the proper class for the entry; entries improperly classified will not be changed or judged. We reserve the right to accept or refuse an exhibit
- 6. Exhibits must be made or grown since August 13, 2022 by the person entering the exhibit.
- 7. Where any conflicts occur between these general rules and the special rules governing the different departments, the special rule will take precedence. The Fair Board reserves the right to determine all matters and difference in regard thereto including amendments.
- 8. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 9. No admission passes will be issued to exhibitors competing for prize money.
- 10. Exhibits may not be removed until after 10pm on Saturday, August 12, 2023 and between 10am and 2pm on Sunday, August 13, 2023.
- 11. Premiums on all exhibits will be paid on Saturday, August 12, 2023 after 10pm and Sunday, August 13, 2023 between 10am and 2pm.
- 12. The stub from the exhibit tag must be presented to redeem the cash premium.
- 13. Articles and/or premium money not picked up by 2pm on Sunday, August 13, 2023 will be moved to the Southampton County Extension Office, Courtland, and kept until 5pm on Friday, August 26, 2023. After that time, the appropriate disposal will be made. Premiums will not be mailed unless a mistake has been made by the fair administration.
- 14. The Fair Board will not be responsible for any accident or injury to the person or property of any exhibitor, spectator, attendant, or any other person. The exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Fair Board against any claim or liability for damage by him or his animal.
- 15. Any insurance desired on any entry or animal must be acquired by the exhibitor.
- 16. Entries will be accepted in each department on a first come basis. The exhibitor will be advised if all spaces have been assigned prior the receipt of any entry. The chairperson in charge will assign space.
- 17. All articles received will be entirely under the control and jurisdiction of the management of the Fair. No exhibitor will be allowed to remove, handle, or rearrange the exhibit.
- 18. The right is reserved by the Fair Board to withhold the prizes awarded in every case in which it appears the regulations set forth have not been complied with, or that fraud or deception has been attempted, or where the article or animal is not worthy. The Fair Board's decision will be final and binding on all parties.
- 19. If it is ascertained by any exhibitor, in any ungentlemanly manner, refuses to comply with the regulations set forth by the Fair Board, and has taken exception to the judgment of a judge or any awarding committee, the Board of Directors shall bar the person so offending from the competition for a premium or exhibiting on the grounds of the Fair until he shall be made proper amends and has been reinstated by a vote of majority from the Board of Directors.
- 20. If it is ascertained that an exhibitor or person associated with an exhibitor has made or caused to make a false statement in regard to any animal or articles exhibited, or if the exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibit shall be excluded from competing or from exhibition on the grounds of the Fair.

AWARDS

(Note Carefully)

In the event of circumstances beyond the Fair Boards control occur and disrupt the planned schedule as to necessitate curtailment of activities and operation, the Fair Board reserves the right and the exhibitor agrees, to pro-rate premium and prize monies herein catalogued on a basis of actual conditions existing from such causes during the period of the Fair. Premiums and prizes are paid ONLY for awards made by judges as they appear on the signed judge's sheet and cards of record and NOT from ribbons attached to the exhibit, unofficial newspaper reports, or other listings. This rule is strictly enforced due to the fact that the judge's reports are the only official reports of the correct awards. Ribbons may be misplaced or tampered with and newspaper listings may be incorrect.

JUDGES

Should any doubt arise as to the regularity of an entry, or any other important matter, which the judge feels incompetent to decide, he shall at once report it to the Chairman of the department who shall in turn, bring the matter to the attention of the President. No one will be allowed to act as a judge in a department or ring in which he exhibits. All judges will be selected for their known familiarity with the classes on which they are invited to award premiums, and are instructed that if they shall have good reasons to believe that any exhibitor, be false entry or otherwise, attempts to deceive the judges or the public and obtain a premium by misrepresentation, they shall report the fact at once to the Chairman of the department, who shall report the matter at once to the President for action by the Board of Directors. The decision of awarding judges shall be final and no appeal shall be considered except in the case of protest.

Objections to any person serving as a judge must be submitted to the Chairman of the department in writing prior to making award, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore, and the Chairman shall report the matter immediately to the President. An exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judge's during the adjudications will be promptly excluded from competition.

PROTESTS

Protests against an award must be made in writing, accompanied by affidavits, which must specify in full the ground for protests, and such a deposit of \$10 to the Fair Board before the close of the day following the making of such an award. In case the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited to the Board. The Board will notify the exhibitor of the protested animal or exhibit of such protest; and both parties will then have 24 hours to bring sworn testimony in the case to be submitted to the Board of Directors. The protested award will be held in abeyance until the final actions of the Board of Directors passes on it.

GENERAL GATE RULES

- 1. Those with special permits will be the only one's allowed to park inside the gate during the fair hours.
- 2. If you have to feed livestock or stock booths, we ask that you do so before fair hours and then bring your vehicle outside the gate into the parking lot before the fairgrounds open to the public.
- 3. No one will be admitted through the gate without paying admission unless they have a pass with them.





- 12. All contestants appearing in the talent show must arrive at the fairgrounds no later than 6:00 p.m. on Thursday August 11, 2023.
- 13. CD's may be used as well. (Fair will not be responsible for lost tapes and CD's) *No profanity or explicit lyrics permitted.*
- 14. Songs must be appropriate.

- 1. All persons making entries should read and understand the GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- 2. All items to be exhibited must be entered between 8am and 1pm on Tuesday, August 9, 2023. Adult exhibits will be judged at 2pm. Only one entry per class will be accepted.
- 3. All items must be from a field of at least one acre.
- 4. In classes 13 and 14, the ears must be the shuck at the time of judging. Do not husk the ear before entering the judging. Only the judge will be allowed to husk the ears. Class 15 and 16 must be husked.
- 5. All entries in the youth category will be judged as they are entered. Exhibitors must be present for judging. No exhibits in the youth classes will be entered or judged if the exhibitor is not present. The exhibitor will remain with each item until entered and judged.
- 6. Exhibits will be entered in one of the two age categories: Youth – 19 & younger Adult – 20 & older
- 7. Each class in the Adult category will be awarded one blue, one red, and one white ribbon. No ribbons will be awarded if not worthy. Prize money will not be awarded for adults.
- 8. Ribbons will be awarded to entries in the youth division.
- 9. Prize money will be awarded according to ribbon color in the YOUTH DIVISION ONLY as follows:

YOUTH LIVESTOCK, POULTRY & RABBIT SHOWS

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. All Franklin-Southampton County Fair livestock shows are open to 4-H members from Southampton county and adjacent Virginia counties and cities who are 9 years old by September 30, 2023 and are not older than 19 on October 1, 2023.
- 2. There will be a non-competitive Cloverbud class for each species open to youth who are at least 5 years old but will be younger than 9 years old as of September 30, 2023.
- *3.* The livestock entered in the fair will be the project animal of the 4-H member and under the 4-H'ers direct care.
- 4. Livestock entered in the fair must be on feed and separated from other livestock by June 11, 2023. The only exception is that the date for feeder pigs will be determined based on availability from the group supplier.
- 5. Registration forms must be received in the Extension Office by 5:00pm on June 9, 2023.
- 6. No livestock exhibits may be removed from the fairgrounds until after 10pm on Saturday August 12 and before 2pm on Sunday August 13.
- 7. The livestock will be weighed-in at the fairgrounds on Tuesday August 8 from 5-7pm. Following weigh-in will be a mandatory exhibitor meeting.
- 8. All exhibitors will be required to participate in the showmanship class for their respective species. Novice exhibitors are youth under 14 years of age that are showing in their first 4-H show for that species. Junior exhibitors are those youth who are under 14 years old as of September 30, 2023, and senior exhibitors are 14 years of age or older as of September 30, 2023.
- 9. Each exhibitor is responsible for feeding and watering his or her animals during the fair.
- *10.* Each exhibitor is responsible for properly bedding his or her animal and removing wet bedding and manure. Bedding will be furnished at no cost to the exhibitor.
- 11. All exhibitors are responsible for a fair number of shifts of Barn Duty.
- *12.* Each exhibitor will receive free admittance to the fair. Parents, friends and family will be required to pay the regular admittance fee.
- *13.* Record books are required to be completed. They will be due Saturday August 12, 2023 at 5:00pm. They will be judged and returned during the 4-H Livestock Banquet.
- 14. The 4-H Livestock Show Committee will conduct a strict barn monitoring system and any animal thought to present a health problem will be sent home.
- 15. Any animal determined by the judge and show superintendents to be deemed not reasonable controlled by the exhibitor will be immediately removed from the ring.
- 16. Animals will be health checked upon entry & will be sent home if there is any sign of illness.
- 17. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times. The show committee will handle any disagreement with the judge after the show.
- 18. Any exhibitor and or project leader who is found by the Southampton County Fair Livestock Committee to be intentionally violating the above rules will be banned from participating in any Southampton County Fair 4-H livestock event for life.
- 19. Southampton County Co-operative Extension and The Southampton County Fair will not be responsible for loss, damage or accident to any person, animal, or property. By making an entry, each exhibitor agrees to abide by the rules of the show and to abide with any final decisions of the show committee.
- 20. All entries are subject to on farm inspections to verify entry information. All exhibitors agree to accommodate such inspections.
- 21. Prize money may be adjusted based on sponsorships received.
- 22. Exhibitors must show their own entries unless the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class. Substitute show persons must be eligible 4-H members.
- 23. The Livestock Committee may cancel a show if there are not enough entries.
- 24. The Livestock Committee recommends that each exhibitor show no more than two species.
